History of Meetings, Communications and Consultations with Local Officials and Government Offices

June 21, 2022: MOA Municipal Manager and Senior Members. Paul Schneider, Eaglexit Acting Chair met with MOA Municipal Manager Amy Demboski, Chief of Staff Alexis Johnson and the two Assembly District 2 Assemblymembers to discuss detachment from Anchorage including the major fiscal, operational, service, and transition components involved in possible detachment and incorporation. Principal topics discussed included bond-debt liability, police and fire services, PERS liability for existing Eagle River employees, NALA landfill issues, AWWU infrastructure, parks and recreation, roads, animal control, land-use/code enforcement, municipal legal, human resources, OMB, finance, purchasing, operating-budget matters, utilities and enterprises, and OEM-related issues .

June 22, 2022: As a result of that consultation, then-Chief Fiscal Officer Travis Frisk issued a June 22, 2022 memorandum (Exhibit 6, Frisk letter), with municipal finance and debt-support attachments, addressing the potential fiscal impact of the Eaglexit succession

concept, including outstanding general-obligation bond debt, potential restructuring costs, credit-rating issues, and estimated debt-allocation assumptions. The memorandum expressly stated that its responses were based on reasonable and known assumptions at that time and that the figures were subject to change.

November 4, 2022: (Exhibit 5, Bronson Admin Signed Letter), Eaglexit received a written response from then-Municipal Manager Amy Demboski to Paul Schneider. That letter is an important formal MOA consultation record because it confirms that Eaglexit met with senior MOA officials, that MOA identified the principal fiscal and operational issues the petitioners should address, and that MOA provided or referenced supporting materials for consideration in any detachment and incorporation petition. The letter recapped the June 21 meeting and identified the same major categories of concern, including bond-debt liability, police and fire, State of Alaska PERS liability for existing Eagle River employees, Anchorage School District issues, NALA landfill and solid-waste matters, Anchorage wastewater and water utilities, and parks, recreation, and road-service areas.

At the same time, the letter made clear that MOA was not assuming responsibility for preparing Eaglexit's transition plan or conducting the petitioners' additional research. Strategically, the letter supports the record that consultation occurred under the 3 AAC 110.900 transition-planning framework, while also confirming that Eaglexit must convert MOA's information into a practical transition, budget, debt, service-continuity, and asset/liability plan for LBC review.

January 30, 2024 at 12:00 pm: Bill Popp, mayoral candidate. Catherine Margolin, George Snodgrass, Lee Hammermeister, and Michael Tavoliero met with Bill Popp to discuss detachment from Anchorage.

February 7, 2024 at 12:00 pm: Chris Tuck, mayoral candidate. Catherine Margolin, George Snodgrass, Lee Hammermeister, and Michael Tavoliero met with Chris Tuck to discuss detachment from Anchorage.

February 1, 2024 and March 11, 2024: Petitioners met on two separate occasions with Mayor Dave Bronson, Ross Risvold, Public Finance & Investments Manager, Alden Thern, Chief Fiscal Officer, Veronica Hoxie, Communications Director, Mario Bird, Municipal Attorney/Chief of Staff, Desiree Velez, Secretary to the Mayor, and Sharon Lechner, OMB Director. In the later meeting, Eaglexit initially submitted a proposed Memorandum of Understanding to the Municipality of Anchorage Mayor's Office and a list of questions to create a centralized technical-consultation process for transition planning. The list of questions was responded to in draft form by Mario Bird (Exhibit 17, Mario Bird Letter) The purpose was not to ask MOA to endorse detachment or incorporation, but to identify affected services, assets, liabilities, debts, tax-administration issues, service-continuity needs, and unresolved questions for later Local Boundary Commission review under 3 AAC 110.900.

Although MOA did not enter into the proposed MOU (MOU is not included as an exhibit) and previously indicated that information could be provided through the ordinary public-records process, the consultation record was materially advanced by the OMB Director, Sharon Lechner, who submitted a draft response to Eaglexit's questions (Exhibit 1, Sharon Lechner Response to Eaglexit Questions).

That response, together with Mrs. Lechner's subsequent consultation, considerably framed this Transition Plan's substance and content of Eaglexit's approach to the questions surrounding transition under 3 AAC 110.900: how the proposed Chugach Regional Borough would assume relevant and appropriate powers, duties, rights, and functions presently exercised by the Municipality of Anchorage; how affected services would be transferred, continued, contracted, or otherwise maintained in an orderly, efficient, and economical manner; and how assets, liabilities, debts, service-area funds, contracts, records, and related obligations would be identified and integrated without loss of asset value, damage to credit reputation, or impairment of bond-rating treatment.

February 9, 2024 at 12:00 pm: Suzanne LaFrance, mayoral candidate. Catherine Margolin, Nani Palmer, George Snodgrass and others met with Suzanne LaFrance to discuss detachment from Anchorage.

February 1, 2024 at 1:15 pm: Meeting with Mayor Dave Bronson, Mario Bird, Alden Thern, Ross Risvold, Veronica Hoxie, Scott Myers and Eaglexit representatives regarding the proposed MOU and interrogatories concerning MOA assets and liabilities.

February 1, 2024: Follow-up email to mayor and staff requesting signed MOU.

February 2, 2024: Mario Bird responded indicating the administration would review the matter and respond.

February 15, 2024 at 11:00 am: Meeting with LBC staff Jedediah Smith and Sally Russell Cox.

February 29, 2024: Assembly member Scott Myers emailed Mario Bird requesting an update.

March 12, 2024: LBC Public Meeting testimony by Michael Tavoliero and George Snodgrass regarding information needed to complete the petition.

March 11, 2024: Meeting with Mayor Bronson, staff, Scott Myers and Eaglexit representatives regarding the MOU and interrogatories.

March 15, 2024: Letter from Mario Bird acknowledging the previous communications history of meetings and communications between the MOA and Eaglexit and establishing a hierarchy for the questions in the submitted interrogatory. See Exhibit 17, Mario Bird Letter. It also made clear that the MOA would continue to cooperate with Eaglexit, with the understanding that the MOA would not spend excessive time or money in responding to Eaglexit's questions.

5/2/2024: Eaglexit Education Committee and members of Eaglexit Board met with the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development's Commissioner, Deena Bishop regarding the development of the CRB School District education model. Present included Dina Bishop, aid Cathy Moffit, Ric Smith, Dana Smith, Lee Hammermeister, Catherine

Margolin (chair, Eaglexit) and Michael Tavoliero (board member, Eaglexit). Discussed the formation of a charter school district as a concept and did brainstorming on ideas.

June 17, 2024: Meeting with ASD senior leadership regarding detachment. Present were Ric Smith, Eaglexit Education Committee Chair; Catherine Margolin, Eaglexit Chair; Andy Ratliff, Chief Financial Officer; Jim Anderson, Chief Operating Officer; Marin Lang, Chief Human Resources Officer; Katy Grant, Executive Assistant. Topics discussed were the transition of education services from ASD to the new CRB, the costs of special needs education, and how to cooperatively transition.

June 2024: Eaglexit through its Education Committee engaged the Anchorage School District as a practical school-transition stakeholder for purposes of developing the Chugach Regional Borough School District transition plan. The consultation record shows that ASD scheduled a June 2024 meeting with senior district leadership, including finance, operations, and human-resources officials; Eaglexit provided written questions and follow-up requests; ASD requested an electronic copy of the questions and clarification of the proposed Assembly District 2 boundary, including issues related to JBER; and ASD later provided informational responses to the questionnaire. ASD expressly stated that its responses were informational only and did not constitute official District support for detachment. This narrative is therefore offered as evidence of school-transition consultation and record development, not as evidence of ASD endorsement.

9/27/2024: Eaglexit Education Committee and members of Eaglexit Board met with the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development's Commissioner, Deena Bishop regarding the development of the CRB School District education model. Ric Smith, Dana Smith, Lee Hammermeister, and Aid Cathy Moffit, plus Catherine Margolin (chair, Eaglexit) and Michael Tavoliero (board member, Eaglexit). Discussed how school districts can be improved, success strategies.

December 5, 2024: Letter from ASD answering certain Eaglexit questions.

May 15, 2026 : Meeting with the Municipality of Anchorage mayor's office. Present: Bill Falsey, Chief Administrative Officer, Eaglexit Liaison; Lance Wilbur, Chief Fiscal Officer; Nolan Klouda, Policy Director; Sharon Lechner, Consultant to Eaglexit; Catherine Margolin, Chair, Eaglexit; Lance Roberts, Vice-Chair, Eaglexit; Michael Tavoliero, Founder and Board Member, Eaglexit. Discussed division of assets and liabilities, steps needed to detach and incorporate, regulation 3 AAC 110.270(e). Also discussed GO Bonds and debts, MOA trust fund.

That meeting confirmed that consultation is not the same as consent and that the immediate purpose is to build a technical record identifying data needs, preserving service continuity, protecting credit and asset value, avoiding double taxation or unfunded services during transition, and distinguishing disputed from undisputed issues for LBC review .

The parties discussed that asset and liability treatment should not rely on a single mechanical percentage, but should be evaluated fund-by-fund and service-by-service according to legally relevant factors such as revenue source, legal restriction, benefited

area, asset location, tax-base contribution, and continuing service obligation. The parties also discussed prior debt materials, possible credit-protection structures, and the need to update older MOA fiscal-impact assumptions before any final settlement position is advanced.

The parties also agreed to schedule another meeting to continue the technical consultation process. Accordingly, the petitioners are not presently relying on a consultation waiver as the primary transition posture; instead, the petition should treat the MOA consultation record as ongoing, documented, and subject to supplementation through additional meetings, public-records responses, technical exchanges, and any future transition agreements or LBC conditions.

May 29, 2026: Catherine (chair) sent followup email with thank you.

History of Events and Other Participation

Eaglexit believes in participating in community events in order to keep our name and mission in the forefront of the community awareness.

1. Bear Paw: Eaglexit has maintained a booth at the annual Eagle River Bear Paw festival for several years. We sell merchandise, give out flyers and other informational materials, and encourage people to walk in and have conversations with us.

Eaglexit also has had a float in the Bear Paw parade every year for several years, with 2026 being no exception. We give out candy and other kid-friendly

knickknacks, as well as items that adults can appreciate such as frisbees and hand-held flags.

2. Chugiak July 4 parade: Eaglexit has had a float in the parade for several years. We give away candy and other swag during the parade, as well as pass out flyers and announcements.
3. In 2026, Eaglexit (501(c)(3) board members are working as volunteers with Eaglexit Action volunteers to assist in soliciting signatures for the petition. Eaglexit Action has been formed as a 501 (c)(4) nonprofit organization to continue the petition signatures process.
